NAME held its 2008 Annual Conference in Philadelphia at the Hyatt Regency Penn's Landing. NAME once again started off with a pre-conference Academy held the day before the official commencement of the conference. Once again, it was met with resounding success.

The actual conference, "A Heritage of Service in Medicaid and Special Education" was well attended, despite the economic crisis and inability to get agency funding in order to attend. We were pleased Secretary of Education, Valerie Woodruff and David Michalik came to welcome NAME attendees.

NAME hosted a very impressive group of General Session Speakers, including Representatives from the American Association of School Administrators, the Department of Health Policy of the George Washington University School of Public Health Services, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, NYS Office of the Medicaid Inspector General, and the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities. New, relevant, often critical information and perspectives were in evidence.

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services has reported that they have completed most of the responses from their session and they are currently undergoing an internal review prior to being released. We can anticipate the response to most of the questions by the end of November/early December and will post these on the NAME website.
